# **Meditation and Bible Study**

Meditation is a prolonged and focused thought. It involves holding onto a spiritual thought until it totally works its way through you. It ends in a changed or affected life.

Christian Meditation much like Eastern meditation involves purging (or emptying), but also seeks to fill the mind with God's thoughts (big difference between the two).

- Joshua 1:8, meditate and do everything in it.
- Meditation stresses two things: **discipline & time**
- Meditation ties in with other spiritual disciplines. It is a means to an end, not an end in itself. It is to bring greatness to God.

#### Don'ts concerning meditation:

a. Don't meditate upon yourself

- b. Don't get alone with your own thoughts but with God's thoughts
  - **Scripture** is the best tool to use in meditation: Psalm 103:1-2, Proverbs 3:5-6, Isaiah 50:4, Philippians 4:6-7

## Five Suggestions to Make Meditation more successful:

- a. Start small, 10 or 15 minutes, and seek to progress
- b. Emphasize different words within a passage
- c. Ask questions of the text
- d. Apply the passage to your life
  - What truth should I gain?
  - Should I eliminate something from my life after reading this?
- e. Translate or paraphrase the passage into your own words

• **Scripture** -is not an end in itself, but a means to an end. That end is Jesus Christ. He is the authority and Lord over Scripture. He is what scripture is all about.

#### Important things to consider about Scripture Study:

a.Being exposed to the Word strengthens our faith. (Romans 10:17) b. We need to read the Bible.

- c. Richard Foster on studying the Bible, "let what we are studying form and shape our lives."
- d. Notice the connection between Meditation and Bible Study.
- e. We should memorize the Bible. (Psalm 119:11)
- f. We can apply it to our lives and ministry (practical, everyday ministry).

## The Role of the Holy Spirit - Illumination:

a. The Holy Spirit's Role is crucial to our understanding of scripture.

- b. The Holy Spirit quickens our minds to understanding.
- c. The Holy Spirit "illuminates" (sheds light upon) God's Word.
- d. John 16:5-16, outlines the ministry of the H.S., points to Christ.
